Holistic veterinary care aids cows

Some aspects of holistic healthcare for humans have become mainstream. Colden, NY-based veterinarian Cynthia Lankenau would like to see the same happen with veterinary care.

A graduate of Cornell University, Lankenau is trained in acupuncture, Western herbs, Chinese herbs, chiropractics and homeopathy. She presented “Holistic Veterinary Medicine for Cows” at the 2023 NOFA-NY Winter Conference.

“Everyone kind of always wonders what ‘holistic’ means,” she said. “What holistic means is you do what works for you.”

She added that looking at the whole animal – not just the part or function or system with an issue – represents a vital part of holistic veterinary care. This includes nutrition, emotional state of the owner and the environment of the barn.

“We need holistic medicine drastically in our dairy industry because we have to reduce drugs and antibiotics,” Lankenau said, “not only for the antibiotic resistance of bacteria but also for expense. A lot of holistic therapies you can easily do on your own.”

By keeping animals healthier, farmers can reduce their bills and operating stress. These methods also provide an alternative to using antibiotics.

Lankenau views this as important irrespective of farming method, as the World Healthcare Associated Infections Forum stated that there is an impending public health catastrophe that will be caused by the emergence and spread of bacteria that are resistant to all antibiotics. “We need effective, economical alternatives,” Lankenau said.

She listed a few well-known modalities, including acupuncture, herbal medicine, chiropractic, homeopathy, reiki, BEMER blankets and CO2 therapy. She cautioned farmers to know the sources of their herbs, as low-quality items will not yield positive results and could even harm the animals.

Lankenau encouraged farmers to learn a few basic acupuncture points to help with routine cow issues. “There’s 12 paired and two unpaired meridians in the body,” she said. These send electrical signals through the body. “By massaging and manipulating these points, you have a direct effect on the sympathetic/parasympathetic nervous system.” Each point has a specific effect.

Stimulating points can include pressure from fingers, rubbing in essential oils and using tuning forks. Lankenau said that although most of the 150 points take years to

For the good of agriculture

In early April, Pennsylvania Farm Bureau members spent a productive morning meeting with legislators, then gathered to hear the commonwealth's top political figures discuss the future of agriculture.

Ag Secretary Russell Redding opened the session with a reminder that highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) remains a threat to poultry. He reiterated the critical role of the animal health and diagnostic lab system and discussed the state level Farm Bill that benefits Pennsylvania agriculture.

Governor Josh Shapiro acknowledged the importance of state government's strong relationship with Farm Bureau. "It's Republicans and Democrats breaking bread together, talking together about issues that should unite us, not divide us," he said.

Shapiro discussed the need to protect the heritage of rural communities, especially in the face of challenges such as overregulation and HPAI. "HPAI is one of the biggest animal health emergencies in American history, and it's hitting us particularly hard," he said. "It's been almost a year since Pennsylvania confirmed its first case of avian flu in decades ... This year, the first case of avian flu was reported on January 30, about four months earlier than last year due to warmer weather and earlier bird migration."

HPAI impacts farmers, contributes to rising consumer costs and impacts biomedical research across the state. "For the sake of our farmers and our economy, we need to double down on our efforts to mitigate the spread of avian flu, and that's what my administration is going to do with partners and leaders in the General Assembly," said Shapiro. "Under the leadership of Acting Secretary Russell Redding, the Department of Agriculture has been on the ground responding to threats to our poultry industry."

Since HPAI first hit, Pennsylvania has lost nearly five million birds. The efforts of 170 experts have helped poultry farmers keep their flocks safe. So far, 420,000 tests have been conducted to help diagnose and reduce the spread of HPAI.

"We've developed biosecurity protocols," said Shapiro, "and we're working with farmers to implement plans."

Shapiro wants agriculture to do a better job partnering with outside organizations. "Oftentimes those are trusted more by farmers in the community than government or government officials," he said, "and we are doing a better job partnering with outside organizations to drive the message out about the importance of biosecurity measures, particularly with backyard flocks. These experts are working to wipe out the virus where it hits, reducing the spread and supporting impacted farmers - including helping farmers who have lost birds."

Pennsylvania is the only state with a \$25 million fund set aside for farmers to recoup HPAI losses. Nine million dollars have been paid out to poultry farmers, and Shapiro's budget doubled the fund for a total of \$50 million.

"I'm also proposing an additional \$6 million to reimburse farmers for the supplies they need to get birds tested by certified poultry techs," he said. "These two investments represent a true investment in the farm community and with a fiscally conservative budget."

The HPAI outbreak has resulted in some states banning and blocking Pennsylvania poultry products. Redding and the Ag Department have been actively advocating for the poultry industry and working to reduce restrictions imposed by other states, such as Texas.

Shapiro saluted the work that's been done under Redding and is ready to put aside political differences to come

together to support farmers and grow the state's economy. "Pennsylvania Farm Bureau has long been a partner to farmers and state government to make sure the needs of farmers are met," he said. "I believe we can do this work together, and lawmakers on both sides of the aisle want to take this approach."

Newly elected state Farm Bureau president Chris Hoffman emphasized the importance of Farm Bureau Legislative Day as an opportunity to meet with elected officials to discuss ag issues.

"As farmers, it's our job to educate legislators on matters so important to our families and communities," he said. "After reflecting on our legislative agenda, it becomes clear that Pennsylvania Farm Bureau has a distinct and conscious path forward for agriculture for the Commonwealth - one that includes prosperity, stewardship and collaboration."

Hoffman noted that whole milk has been barred from schools for more than 10 years due to federal nutrition standards. "Ideally, this issue would be solved at the federal level," he said. "I'm grateful that members of the General Assembly are working on a Pennsylvania solution. It's critical for the health of our dairy industry."

SB 297 will give Pennsylvania schools the option to

master, many of the "emergency" points are simple to understand. For those who want to stimulate points with the vibration of a tuning fork, she recommends carrying a middle C fork in the hip pocket. "Middle C is sort of the 'idiot-proof' tuning fork," she said.

Many acupuncture points can prove both easy to learn and use. One is governing vessel (GV) 26 for emergency resuscitation. It's in the center of the nose below the nostrils.

"If you ever have a cow that's down with milk fever and she's one of those rare ones that has that bizarre reaction against calcium and has a cardiac arrest, take your fingernail and bird peck that point as hard as you can and it will bring them back," Lankenau said.

She said the technique works

on newborn calves that aren't breathing, in addition to massaging the chest and getting fluid out of their lungs. The technique works on other animals as well.

To stimulate nursing in calves, stimulating GV-28-01 on the roof of the mouth with fingernail pressure helps. This can also help bloated cows to belch.

Anytime when using topical essential oils with animals, Lankenau said it's important to use a carrier oil such as almond or olive oil as a base and only five to 10 drops of the essential oils - otherwise the oil can burn even cows. For pain, apply copai-ba, Helichrysum, frankincense, lavender or black spruce.

Lankenau said that mastitis and almost all calf problems stem from a deficiency. Applying finger pressure to acupuncture points with essential oil can help

stimulate the body's lymphatic system to clear out excess fluid and improve function of the circulatory system.

Another important acupuncture point is related to rumen - intercostal space (ICS) 10. "Cows have 13 ribs, so when you count up their ribs, it's really easy," Lankenau said. In addition to ICS 10, rib 12 is also considered a point for disorders of rumen, forestomach motility, ruminal atony, bloat and tympany.

For mastitis or cough, she recommends manipulation of the eighth or ninth ICS, or spaces between the ribs when counting from the front of the cow. The benefits of this technique include promotion of mammary gland health and reduction of swelling, along with loosening the chest and alleviating cough.

One of the greatest stressors to

a farmer is when a cow is down for more than 12 to 24 hours. Once a cow experiences bruising from recumbency, she is less likely to get up again. Plenty of vigorous massage to stimulate circulation can help, along with corydalis, a Chinese herb, to relieve pain in the sciatic nerve as it runs through the pelvis. Moving down the legs to where the hamstrings attach to the Achilles tendon, "all of those points are really important to massage," Lankenau said.

She encouraged farmers to get their children involved with promoting cows' wellbeing. "It's the best thing for the kids," Lankenau said. "Give them the brush, tell them where to brush the cow, so they're brushing and stimulating those acupuncture points."

Guidance from a Chinese herbal medicine practitioner

can help fine-tune using herbs in holistic cow care. Lankenau stressed again the importance of obtaining herbs from a reputable import source, and with Western herbs, to seek a trained herbalist with organic, sustainably harvested products.

She prefers using herbal tinctures for newborn calves as they lack the microflora in their rumen to break down whole herbs. For older animals, ground herbs are better absorbed and used than whole herbs. For three days, farmers should hold the milk of cows treated with herbs.

Lankenau said supplementing a cow's diet with turmeric promotes circulation and the gut microbiome, along with inhibiting carcinogenesis. Burdock root promotes health of the lymph system, skin, gut issues and more.

serve whole milk with school meals. To qualify, schools must purchase 100% Pennsylvania-produced milk. "Fluid milk consumption is at an all-time low," said Hoffman, "and I'm thankful members of the General Assembly are working to address this troubling trend."

He noted that lawmakers have proposed language to clarify the definition of milk in Pennsylvania to state that milk comes only from mammals.

"Allowing non-dairy beverages to be labeled 'milk' is not only harmful for the dairy industry, it's misleading to consumer," said Hoffman. "The answer is simple: milk comes from a mammal, nut juice does not."

Hoffman is counting on the General Assembly to pass transportation legislation to recognize the uniqueness of the ag industry. SB 153 would allow milk haulers to travel during declared disaster emergencies. "Prohibiting travel of milk trucks poses a host of problems that may result in a farmer dumping milk," said Hoffman. "That is not an option for struggling dairy farmers."

Another key piece of transportation legislation is HB 84, which would allow farmers with specialized farm equipment to obtain a yearly permit for movement of equipment and eliminate the need for a state police escort.

Solar energy is a relatively new topic for PFB. "Farm

Bureau energy policy remains dedicated to keeping farm production costs down and strengthening energy security by enhancing sustainability," said Hoffman. "We realize the role solar has in our energy landscape and we look to foster the opportunities it brings to farmers by keeping agriculture production at the forefront of the conversation."

PFB supports SB 211, which establishes decommissioning and bonding requirements for developers who install or operate commercial solar facilities in Pennsylvania. Reasonable decommissioning and bonding requirements will help ensure solar sites are properly decommissioned and waste is handled appropriately.

Another proposal would protect prime agricultural land from solar development. "Pennsylvania's farm landscape is a showcase of productive fields that enable agriculture in the Commonwealth to be the largest industry," said Hoffman. "Solar energy has an important role but it's critical we preserve prime farmland for food production."

Hoffman urged farmers to return to their county Farm Bureau to share what they learned. "Remind them of the power and influence of the largest farm organization in Pennsylvania," said Hoffman. "Remind them of the values of being involved and engaged. Remind them that together, we can be transformative for Pennsylvania agriculture."

Roughage-wise,
Sorghum Keeps
Gaining on Corn

In the April 2023 issue of his monthly Crop Soil News (advancedagsys.com), Certified Crop Advisor Tom Kilcer tallied field research conducted on New York dairy farms in 2020 and 2022. The purpose of this study was to determine how well brown-midrib (BMR) forage sorghum could substitute for corn silage in supporting 85 lb. milk/day production level in large frame dairy cows.

The corn silage-based regimen contained 20 lbs. corn silage dry matter (DM), 13.5 lbs. alfalfa silage DM, 5.8 lbs. shell corn DM and 3.2 lbs. Soy Plus DM. The BMR sorghum-based regimen contained 18.8 lbs. sorghum forage DM, 15 lbs. alfalfa silage DM, 6.9 lbs. shell corn DM and 2.4 lbs. Soy Plus DM. With protein in both silages being fairly soluble, using a heat-treated protein (like Soy Plus, with its lowered protein solubility) is a good idea in order to rein in any excess rumen non-protein nitrogen.

Kilcer pointed out that strategic use of manure

provided enough N to both corn- and sorghum-based roughage programs to elevate whole plant forage protein levels to 11%. Compared to the corn silage-based program, the sorghum-based feeding program needed 1.1 lbs. more shell corn but required 0.8 lbs. less Soy Plus. On a 100-cow dairy, he showed that the net savings annually was in the \$3,000 - \$4,000 range.

With respect to best-possible N utilization, he made the following comment on optimized manure management: “Manure may be a superior source due to the gradual release of organic matter throughout the summer. Any manure application needs to be incorporated within an hour of spreading to capture the ammonia nitrogen. This is why more farms are adding manure injection as a standard economic and environmental practice in their operation.”

To make the comparison of sorghum and corn for dairy cattle forages, he stressed the importance of ensiling both feeds at the correct stage of maturity. Eight weeks is the magic number: for sorghum, harvest that amount of time after heads begin to form. For corn, ensile eight weeks after tasseling.

Time management with sorghum culture can be more of a juggling act than it is with corn. Quoting Kilcer again: “In northern areas, you are potentially squeezed between the time for heading and the soil temperature for planting. (In that respect) sorghum is NOT corn silage. It is critical that the soil temperature be above 60° F (preferably above 65°) with the forecast for warmer temperatures the week after planting. Don’t make the mistake I made of planting into soil that was 72°, but three days later after planting got a 40° rain that killed the entire research project. Check the longer-term forecast.”

I had to learn the hard way a lesson similar to what

he described when over a decade ago I advised the ag program at the local vocational center. Impatient to get a sorghum/sudangrass (SS) hybrid planted, I waited until corn planted by neighboring farmers had emerged, then planted this hot climate summer annual. Knowing that corn could germinate at 50°, I figured that when the neighbor’s corn was up enough to form light green rows, this would be an okay time to plant the SS.

The SS emerged, but took a long time to get moving, hindered by what I diagnosed as eyespot. This disease, caused by the fungus *Kabatiella zeae*, is common and can be found across most of the Northeast. This problem is much more common on corn. But apparently my SS managed to run aground in similar fashion. Eyespot is favored by cool wet weather. *K. zeae* spores are spread long distance by wind and locally by rain splashing from crop debris in soil onto host plants.

For planting sorghum (or SS), Kilcer strongly stressed that drilling in narrow rows or 15-inch rows is far superior to planting in 30-inch corn rows. His research found sorghum yielded 18% more when drilled than when planted in corn row width. (Narrower rows intercept more solar radiation in early crop development than is the case with wider rows.) The more uniform spacing increases stalk size and decreases lodging potential. Even without a heavy fertile seed head on male sterile sorghum, too high a population for the row space will increase lodging.

Kilcer explained, “If you insist on 30-inch row spacing, then we suggest a maximum of 4 lbs. of seed/acre; 15-inch rows, 5 - 6 lbs. of seed/acre; and drilled, 6 - 7 lbs. of seed. Actually, we need to be talking in terms of the number of seeds/acre (just like we do with corn), as sorghums range from 12,500 to 17,000 seeds/lb. 65,000

NYFB leaders highlight Farm Bill priorities

New York Farm Bureau leaders and members spoke on April 14 in Binghamton about the significance and need for a strong Farm Bill at a special U.S. House Ag Committee listening session hosted by U.S. Rep. Marc Molinaro, a member of the committee, and its chair, U.S. Rep. Glenn "GT" Thompson of Pennsylvania. U.S. Rep. Nick Langworthy also took part in the event.

The five-year Farm Bill is up for renewal this year and is the most impactful piece of legislation for food and farming in this country. The legislation includes funding for critical safety net programs to protect farmers during times of natural disasters, major crop loss and low prices to safeguard our country's food supply.

It also funds essential conservation programs to protect the environment and

supports needed research programs that improve how farmers grow food and care for livestock. In addition, the nutrition title of the Farm Bill helps to feed millions of low-income Americans in every community in this country.

NYFB's overarching priorities include:

- Increase baseline for Farm Bill program spending
- Maintaining a unified Farm Bill which includes nutrition programs and farm programs together
- Any changes to current farm legislation be an amendment to the Agricultural Adjustment Act of 1938 or the Agricultural Act of 1949
- Prioritize risk management tools which include both federal crop insurance and commodity programs as top funding priorities
- Ensure adequate USDA staffing capacity and technical assistance

capacity and technical assistance

During the listening session, NYFB President David Fisher spoke of how the Farm Bill touches the diversity of NY agriculture, saying, "New York is truly unique due to the nature of agricultural products that are grown and made including livestock, dairy, specialty crops, row crops and aquaculture, but also the interactions with urban areas of the state, including one of the largest markets in the world, New York City. The Farm Bill provides a critical safety net to New York farmers as well as provides critical resources to ensure the longevity of the agriculture industry."

NYFB Vice President Eric Ooms spoke in detail about the need for dairy risk management programs to support the state's largest commodity as well as other needed dairy reforms, adding, "I

also want to highlight opportunities for Federal Milk Marketing Order reform including addressing the higher of for Class I milk pricing, mandatory reporting for cost and yield information and overall greater dairy farmer input on dairy pricing reform to create meaningful change for dairy farmers."

(seeds/acre) is our population for 30-inch rows. Drilled into good soils with good fertility we want 100,000 to 110,000. Don't let anyone convince you to plant higher population or it will be lodged when you come to harvest. We don't do that with corn, don't do it with forage sorghum!"

He also advised growers to check older drills when planting these low populations, since they may be planting sorghum flour instead of seeds. If at the low seed rate, the mechanism is smaller than the seed size, it will grind the seed and nothing will grow. If this happens, growers should set the drill at double the desired population and then plug every other hole to increase the row spacing. This is not ideal, but it's better than planting sorghum flour.

The idea of doubling the theoretical seed drop/acre while plugging every other hole in the drill works. That's

what we had to do years back at the vocational school mentioned earlier. We wanted to plant a two-acre piece with tyfon forage turnips using an antiquated Van Brunt grain drill. Recommended seeding rate was 3 lbs./acre. There was no way we could tone down seed drop that

low with 7-inch rows. Plugging every other row made successful 14-inch rows attainable. The school's beefers enjoyed the foliage during grazing season. Deer dug through the snow for turnip treats all winter.

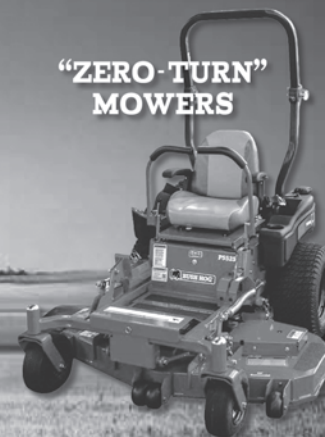
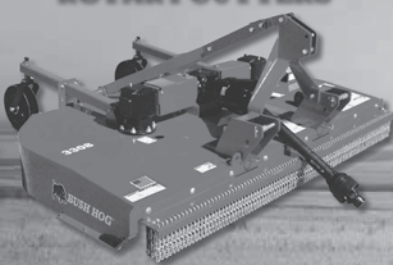

Dairy Day draws great crowd of producers to Cooperstown

Cornell Cooperative Extension's Central New York Dairy, Livestock & Field Crops team hosted this year's Dairy Day event on April 11 at the Otesaga Resort Hotel in Cooperstown, NY. The meeting was led by dairy management specialist Dave Balbian, in coordination with colleagues Nicole Tommell (farm business management specialist), Eric Smith (field crop specialist) and Ashley McFarland.

The gathering represented a broad swath of Central New York's farmers - including attendees from Fulton, Montgomery, Herkimer, Saratoga, Schoharie, Chenango, Madison and Otsego counties.

The day began with a trade show, where attendees could filter into the venue, grab coffee and refreshments, network and visit with each other - and connect with key players from Farm Credit East, Balchem, ASAP Interiors, NBT Bank and many more. Attendees were then directed into breakout sessions.

In her opening session, titled "What Does the Data Say About High Production and Profitability?" Tommell spoke briefly to her own background and her work as team lead for CNYDLFC before launching into the focus for the day: increased profit and profitability through good management. The focus of her session and the talks with farm operational teams was on isolating each facet of the farming operation, from the nutrition to reproductive program, evaluating the costs involved while weighing necessary investment and maximizing each output to increase the bottom line.

A quote mentioned in her presentation, attributed to Peter Drucker, summed this up this approach well: "You cannot manage what you can't measure." Some cost factors that were mentioned were feed cost per cow per day, marginal milk

response and feed efficiency - as well as some factors that are often overlooked, such as feed cost per kilogram of dry matter or cost per unit of nutrient.

"When we go home today," Tommell wrapped up, "we don't have the luxury of choosing our bill prices. However, we can do everything that we can in order to improve our milk yield. I put that to you as a challenge. Like I said in the beginning, there are things on your farm that you can change. After listening [to these farm teams today] think about everything and take home one thing that you can do to impact your farm on a very basic level. That's our challenge to you today."

Two farm operations presented in two separate sessions - first, the Brumar Farm Team of Fort Plain, NY, represented by owner/operators Bruce, Marcy and Eric Matis, nutritionist Shawn Lasher and Dr. Lisa Tobler, DVM. The second farm team represented Woodlawn Dairy of Richfield Springs, NY - owner/operators Tim and Mike Cantwell, nutritionist Kienan Gridley and Dr. Erika Osborne, DVM.

Both teams discussed their origins and backgrounds, the span of growth for their operations and the specifics of their current operational setup: herd size, the size of their calving program, the number of barns and enclosures, types of pasture setup, etc.

Then, in a roundtable setup, they walked through each aspect of their operation and discussed how they managed each of those facets to maximum results, from crop rotation and harvest to animal feed and nutrition to reproduction and more. Once each session was complete, both teams took questions from attendees.

New farmer knowledge: Property purchase agreements

If you've ever considered owning farmland, there's a lot you need to do before signing on the dotted line. Often that involves working with an attorney to make sure you're getting the best deal, but attorneys don't come cheap.

Enter the Agriculture Law Education Initiative (ALEI).

Margaret Todd is legal research associate with ALEI, a collaboration between three attorneys to create free resources and educational events to serve Maryland's ag community – including a webinar where Todd spoke about property purchase agreements.

Like any big decision, the best place to begin is by asking yourself what your non-negotiables are and what should take top priority. Todd suggested making a list of the pros and cons around owning property.

Pros would include more security in the land and your operation, building equity and creating a source of collateral. One of the biggest cons, however, is “tying up a lot of your assets, potentially creating a large source of debt for you and although it's security, it's also a very permanent asset that may have little flexibility.”

Considering how the land will be utilized, both in the present and down the road, is necessary. Questions to ask might include “What if I want to use my farm to host educational events or start a food production value-added business component? What are the types of facilities I would need? Would the zoning of my property allow for that?”

If you're unsure about a property, you can give the seller a letter of intent to let them know you're interested. However, Todd warned, the letter isn't binding, so in the time it takes you to become a buyer, the seller is still free to accept any legally binding offer they may receive.

You'll need to decide if you or your business will be the owner. If it's you, will your business rent it from it you? A money-saving idea would be to have business partners or be a part of a co-op or an LLC. It's a great way to reduce individual expenses and share responsibilities. However, this brings up another set of questions to be answered before purchasing: Who gets what percentage of the ownership and who takes care of what part of the business?

To help guide you, Todd mentioned Land for Good and the Young Farmers Coalition, which has a lot of great (mostly free) resources to help find answers to these and many other questions.

Getting a loan for a farm often means working with multiple lenders. According to Todd, “You may be able to get preapproved through a private lender farm credit, but with the USDA Farm Service Agency, you won't. They'll cover up to around \$600,000 of a purchase expense but you must work with a commercial lender.” The FSA has loan officers who can guide you through the process.

After decided owning farmland is what's right for you, how do you protect yourself financially throughout and long after you have closed the deal?

A contingency regarding loan approval is a term you want included in your purchase agreement, said Todd. “It will protect you if your financing doesn't come through and during the actual purchase process,” she said.

Since the pandemic, deep-pocketed investors or individuals have been snatching up properties in every market, sending costs skyrocketing. Cash offers with no contingencies are not unusual, which makes it difficult to protect yourself from losing money should something go wrong after the purchase.

Despite this, Todd warned to not succumb to market pressure. “If the seller is asking you to waive contingencies or inspections, often the answer is going to be ‘no’ because you would be exposing yourself to more risk,” she said.

When you begin your search for property, consider working with local ag service providers. “If there is a

county economic development office, they may be able to help you, as would a realtor who has experience with farmland transactions,” Todd said. “It would be wiser for both sides to get their own agent to avoid any conflict of interest.” It's important for the agent to provide you with a copy of a contract outlining specifically what services they are obligated to provide.

Make sure to learn what fees the buyer and seller are responsible for paying. Todd also advised the buyer to

add a 90-day period to conduct due diligence in the offer. At the conclusion of the transaction, each party will receive a closing statement listing all the outstanding fees in addition to the cost of the property.

Once both parties agree on the terms, the agreement is signed, making it a legally binding contract which is then converted into the purchase agreement. Then

a down payment is put into a third-party holding account (escrow), after which you will receive the financing documents from the lender.

"The lender will require you purchase property insurance," Todd said. "It's important for your agent to note any hazards or

insurance risks ... as this could cause your insurance rate to be very high."

You'll then sign the deed, which normally includes the names of the parties, the legal description of the property and any types of restrictions that go along with it. It's then recorded with the

Office of Land Records.

Buyers will also want to get title insurance to make sure the land being purchased is free and clear of any liens, encumbrances or easements. Hiring a title insurance company to do so saves a lot of time. However, said Todd, "be sure and read

the policy terms to see in what instances you would be entitled to any sort of compensation, including if something comes up in the title after you've closed the transaction."

There is also an agricultural declaration of intent. If the property is being used for agriculture, it's

normally taxed at a lower rate than a commercial property. Failing to do this could have you paying significant back taxes on the property.

What happens if the seller breaches the contract? "The buyer would be able to request specific performance, which just

means that you want them to satisfy the contract as they've agreed to," said Todd.

On the topic of due diligence, it's important that when the buyer signs the agreement, they are "assuming the risk that restrictive covenants, zoning laws and other recorded documents may restrict or prohibit the use of the property for the purposes intended by the buyer."

For example, "If the seller knows what you want to do with the property, they don't have to guarantee that the property is suitable for your purposes. A lot of times you'll hear about property rights as ownership rights, that you can do whatever you want with your property ... but there could also be an easement agreement in place," Todd said.

If the property is being used as a farm at the time of the sale, don't assume that's something that you can carry on because it's possible the seller had been given a special exception.

Todd also cautioned to be mindful that even if something is allowed by zoning, there is no guarantee your neighbors will be okay with it. Some counties require the approval of the neighboring properties.

Finally, in your purchase agreement you will want to include what's being transferred with the property, such as fences, gates or sheds. If there are any structures already built, such as barns, you'll want to know if any of the equipment inside will be included in the sale price.

"It's good to have all that information included in the addendum to the purchase agreement," Todd said.

Wall Street rules should not extend to family farms

Wall Street rules intended for publicly traded companies should not extend to family farms.

That is the message American Farm Bureau Federation and six other ag groups sent to the Securities and Exchange Commission. The SEC proposed a rule to require public companies to report on Scope 3 emissions, which are the result of activities not owned or controlled by a publicly traded company but contribute to its value chain. Public companies that produce goods from agricultural products would need to report emissions from the relevant ag operations. The farm groups' concern is that the rule will burden family farmers and drive further consolidation in agriculture – all for no real environmental benefit.

In a letter sent to the SEC, the organizations stated, "This tracking will be extremely expensive, invasive and burdensome for farmers and ranchers, at the cost of improved production practices that generate actual environmental gains. Family farms, particularly smaller ones, will be hardest hit, with the rule driving greater consolidation and fewer family farms. The easiest path for registrants will be to source their inputs from larger corporate operations with greater resources and more sophisticated

data-gathering and reporting systems. Alternatively, registrants may simply vertically integrate their supply chains, leading to further consolidation."

In the letter, the organizations ask the SEC to recognize it wouldn't be appropriate to subject farmers to Scope 3 reporting requirements, and to draft a rule that specifies that companies cannot compel farmers and ranchers to provide emissions information.

"While farmers and ranchers play a vital role in America's supply chain, 98% of farms are family owned and 90% of those are small," the letter continues. "This means that a considerable part of the agriculture industry does not fall within the SEC's direct regulation of disclosure information, which extends to regulating public companies (registrants and issuers)."

Signing onto the letter were AFBF, Agricultural Retailers Association, American Soybean Association, National Cattlemen's Beef Association, National Corn Growers Association, National Pork Producers Council and North American Meat Institute.

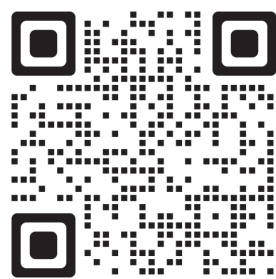

There's more milk coming. The Ag Department raised its 2023 U.S. milk production estimate in the April 11 World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates report (WASDE), again citing a "larger expected cow inventory."

2023 production and marketings were estimated at 228.7 and 227.6 billion lbs., respectively, up 200 million lbs. on production from a month ago and 100 million lbs. more on marketings. If realized, 2023 production would be up 2.2 billion lbs. or 0.97% from 2022.

"Fat basis imports for 2023 were primarily raised on the strength of a number of dairy products during first quarter. Imports of casein and milk protein concentrates are expected to remain firm," said the WASDE, "supporting higher skim-solids basis imports through the year. Expectations of increased competition in butter, cheese, nonfat dry milk and whey markets were reflected in lower forecast exports on both a fat- and a skim-solids basis for 2023."

Cheese and butter price forecasts were raised, nonfat dry milk was lowered. Whey prices were raised on recent prices and stronger expected demand.

Cheese was projected to average \$1.855/lb. in 2023, up 4.5 cents from last month's estimate, but compares to \$2.1122 in 2022, \$1.6755 in 2021 and \$1.9236 in 2020.

Butter was projected to average \$2.42/lb., up 8.5 cents from a month ago, and compares to \$2.8665 in 2022, \$1.7325 in 2021 and \$1.5808 in 2020.

Nonfat dry milk will average \$1.165, down 6.5 cents from last month's estimate and compares to \$1.6851 in 2022, \$1.2693 in 2021 and \$1.0417 in 2020.

Whey was projected at 42.5 cents/lb., up 3.5 cents from the March estimate, and compares to 60.35 cents in 2022, 57.44 cents in 2021 and 36.21 cents in 2020.

The 2023 Class III milk price average is now projected at \$18.25/cwt., up 70 cents from last month's estimate, but compares to the \$21.96 average in 2022, \$17.08 in 2021 and \$18.16 in 2020.

The Class IV was projected lower, at \$18.10, down 20 cents from last month's estimate, and compares to \$24.47 in 2022, \$16.09 in 2021 and \$13.49 in 2020.

This month's U.S. corn outlook is for reductions to imports and food, seed and industrial (FSI) use, with unchanged ending stocks. Corn imports were lowered 10 million bushels. Feed and residual use was unchanged at 5.275 billion. FSI was lowered 10 million bushels. Ending stocks were unchanged at 1.342 billion bushels. The season-average farm price was unchanged at \$6.60/bu. Global production

was forecast at 1.44 billion metric tons, down over 7 million.

Soybean supply and use forecasts were also unchanged. The season-average soybean price forecast remained at \$14.30/bu. Soybean meal was forecast at \$465/short ton and soybean oil remained at 66 cents/lb. Global production, at 369.6 million metric tons, was down 5.5 million.

USDA's first Crop Progress Report of the season shows 3% of the U.S. corn crop had been planted as of the week ending April 9 in the top 18 states that produced 92% of 2022 acreage. That's 1% ahead of this time a year ago and 1% ahead of the five-year average.

Dairy product demand looked strong in February. USDA's latest U.S. Dairy Supply and Utilization Report shows cheese utilization totaled 1.13 billion lbs., up 2.8% from February 2022, driven primarily by a 3% increase in domestic use. Exports were off 0.1% a result of higher other-cheese varieties counteracted by a significant drop in American cheese volume compared to February 2022, according to HighGround Dairy's assessment.

Butter utilization, at 164.3 million lbs., was up 13.1% from a year ago, thanks to domestic usage being up 16.9%. Exports were down 32.1%.

Nonfat dry milk-skim milk powder totaled 175 million lbs., up 1.5% from a year ago, with domestic use up 10.1%. Exports were off 0.5%, although YTD are up 6.5%. HGD cited the weak global economy and tepid demand, and “while domestic utilization increased, February 2022’s domestic numbers were the weakest since 2002, making for a very easy comparison in 2023.”

Dry whey utilization amounted to 65.9 million lbs., up 3.3% from a year ago. Domestic usage was down 3.2%, but exports were up 9.5%.

The cheddar barrels rolled into Chicago big time this week, as 70 loads found new homes at the CME, highest weekly total Jun. 30, 2018. That took the price down to

\$1.5125/lb., down 20.75 cents on the week, lowest CME price since Nov. 22, 2021, 92.75 cents below a year ago and 26.25 cents below the blocks. The barrel lost 45 cents in three weeks.

The blocks closed the second Friday of April at \$1.775, down 5.5 cents on the week, lowest since Sept. 6, 2022 and 59.75 cents below a year ago.

Butter climbed to \$2.375/lb. Wednesday but closed Friday at \$2.3275, up a penny on the week but 42.75 cents below a year ago, with 11 sales.

Grade A nonfat dry milk climbed to \$1.16/lb. Thursday but closed Friday at \$1.13, a half-cent higher on the week but 69.25 cents below a year ago, with 7 sales reported.

StoneX said the powder continues to feel the pressure from the lower GDTs as well as the higher than expected February stocks number, which was up 7.5%.

Dry whey saw its Friday finish at 36.25 cents/lb., a quarter-cent lower on the week and 27.25 cents below a year ago. There were a whopping 47 sales reported on the week, highest weekly total since the week of Jan. 6, 2020.

The week ending April 1 saw 66,800 head of dairy cattle go to slaughter, up 600 from the previous week and 5,800 more than a year ago. YTD, 871,500 cows have been culled, up 32,800 head or 3.9%, from the same period in 2022.

Rising beef prices have incentivized cash strapped dairy producers to cull more or even shutter their operations. The April 12 Daily Dairy Report stated, “Front-month cattle futures reached fresh all-time highs. The April contract settled at \$174.275/cwt., eclipsing the previous high set in October 2015.”

The DDR said, “Beef producers are scrambling to find animals to finish, and they are willing to pay higher prices for dairy calves. A growing share of U.S. dairy producers have been crossbreeding with beef genetics and producing fewer pure dairy calves. This has slowly reduced the supply of U.S. dairy heifers ready to enter the milking herd.”

StoneX broker Dave Kurzawski said dairy beef is making up a bigger percentage of the beef supply than a year ago. Speaking in the April 17 Dairy Radio Now broadcast, he reported culling the past 12 weeks was up 3.5% from a year ago.

He said farmers are doing what they can to “cheapen the ration, to cut costs,” as evidenced in components. Both protein and butterfat were down for the past 12 months, he said. “Dairy farmers want to milk cows. That’s what they do for a living. They don’t want to cull animals unless they’re going out of business. Margins will be tough and those with a little extra, with beef prices being what they are, will be culling a little extra,” he concluded. “But the price of milk has a bigger impact on their margin than that of the beef price.”

Tuesday’s Global Dairy Trade Pulse saw 2 million lbs. of Fonterra whole milk powder sold, down 200,000 from the March 28 Pulse, and at just \$3,005/metric ton, down \$15 from the April 4 GDT event.

HighGround Dairy stated, “Whole milk prices fell further in this event to set a new GDT Pulse auction low as weak demand and a poor global macroeconomic environment keep sentiment bearish.”

In other dairy trade news, Cooperatives Working Together (CWT) member co-ops accepted eight offers of export assistance this week that helped them capture sales contracts for 908,000 lbs. of American-type cheese,

RMA adds tropical storm option

Farm Credit East and Crop Growers LLP are pleased the Risk Management Agency (RMA) has announced the addition of tropical storm (TS) coverage as an option to the Hurricane Insurance Protection-Wind Index (HIP-WI) endorsements for the 2023 crop year.

To add the TS option to an existing

policy, a producer must have an underlying crop insurance policy under the Basic Provisions with an HIP-WI endorsement. The TS option covers a tropical storm weather event in which the covered county or adjacent county is deemed within the area of a tropical storm with specific wind speeds and rain accruals,

specified by NOAA and as determined by RMA.

"The addition of this coverage provides increased protection against the harsh and unpredictable weather that can impact many East Coast growers," commented Jeremy Forrett, senior vice president for Crop Growers LLP.

The last date to purchase a TS option for crops with a sales closing date after Nov. 1, 2022 is April 30.

2,000 lbs. of anhydrous milkfat and 132,000 lbs. of whole milk powder.

The product is going to customers in Asia, the Caribbean and Oceania through October and raised CWT's 2023 exports to 13.5 million lbs. of American-type cheeses, 550,000 lbs. of butter, 2,000 lbs. of anhydrous milkfat, 17.9 million lbs. of whole milk powder and 2.5 million lbs. of cream cheese. The products are going to 18 countries and are the equivalent of 287.7 million lbs. of milk on a milkfat basis, according to the CWT.

In politics, the International Dairy Foods Association gave a thumbs up to the FDA's final order announced Thursday to modify the yogurt standard of identity final rule, published on June 9, 2021.

Joseph Scimeca, Ph.D., senior vice president of regulatory and scientific affairs for the IDFA, stated, "Following more than four decades of advocacy from IDFA and formal objections filed by IDFA in July 2021, the FDA announced changes to the 2021 Yogurt Standard of Identity final rule on December 14 that largely aligned with IDFA's requested changes and objections. Today, FDA issued additional clarity on the final rule. IDFA con-

siders the final rule a win for consumers and yogurt makers." Complete details are posted on the IDFA's website.

The American Dairy Coalition in a letter to Ag Secretary Tom Vilsack, urged him to deny two recent Federal Milk Marketing Order (FMMO) hearing petitions which ask for increased payments from farmers' pockets to processors in order to offset higher input costs.

"Holding a federal milk pricing hearing on only these 'make allowances,' without the opportunity to look at additional concerns facing dairy farmers, is misaligned," the ADC charged. "As a grassroots dairy farmer organization, ADC believes a comprehensive FMMO hearing is needed. We also do not support 'make allowance' updates based on processors having the ability to voluntarily participate in the cost surveys, which undoubtedly would exclude essential relevant data. Farmers need transparency in order to understand how their net payment is calculated, and these 'make allowances' are not line items. They are embedded in pricing formulas," said ADC CEO Laurie Fischer.

"The milk component pricing that is credited

with make allowances only captures the value of about 10% of milk sales today. The specific products that are included in the circular end-product pricing formulas are: block and barrel cheddar cheese, salted butter, nonfat dry milk and dry whey.

"This means 90% of total milk sales do not have their end-product prices captured, not even for informational purposes or market transparency. USDA only surveys the prices of the specific products that are used in the FMMO formulas," Fischer pointed out. "Processors have the flexibility to offset costs from additional sales opportunities the non-formula products represent without having the increased value they extract from consumers captured and used in the FMMO formulas that establish the minimum prices paid to farmers."

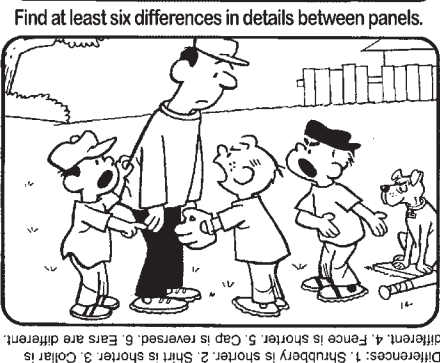
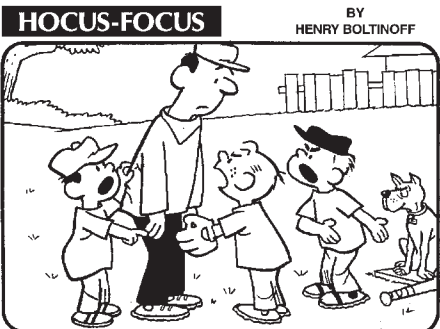

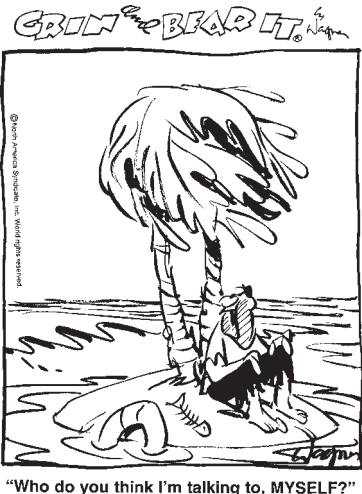

Kovels Antiques and Collecting: Tiffany Studios

Tiffany Studios is synonymous with luxury and decorative items like jewelry, useful pieces made of precious metals and elaborate stained-glass lamps. The company also made practical objects, such as its line of commercial desk accessories made from about 1890 to the 1930s.

Desk sets include items that office workers are unlikely to see today, like a rocker blotter in the Bookmark pattern. It sold for \$161 at Cowan's auctions in Cincinnati, Ohio.

The Tiffany Bookmark series featured the marks of early printers surrounded by panels of raised leaves and flowers. During the turn of the century, office

workers would have used a rocker blotter along with a fountain pen and ink stand. Many people who have written with a ballpoint pen have smeared the ink. Fountain pen ink would have taken even longer to dry.

People would speed up the drying with a sprinkle of sand or powder and, later, by blotting it with special paper. This rocker blotter would have held sheets of blotting paper to use on documents written in ink.

Q: I inherited a set of very old metal cookie cutters from my mother. I've never used them but have childhood memories of the cookies made with them. Can you tell me a little about old cookie

cutters? How can I determine the age and price?

A: With "farm" style currently a design favorite, early cookie cutters with their rustic look are fun to collect and display. Cookie cutters are thought to date from about 1475, with the first American cookie cutters made by tinsmiths in East Berlin, CT, about 1720. Tin was the primary material for cookie cutters until 1920, when aluminum became popular. Plastic replaced aluminum after World War II. Metal cookie cutters with "bullet" handles are especially wanted by collectors. Early cutters usually have backs made of uneven pieces of scrap tin.

Tip: Silverware that has been tarnished by eggs will come clean if rubbed with damp salt.

ful that sometimes we take their presence for granted. They're common flowers, but how much do you really know about them?

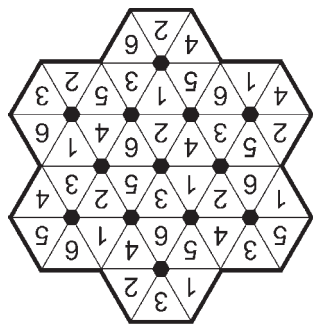
Many people assume that since tulips are associated with Holland, they

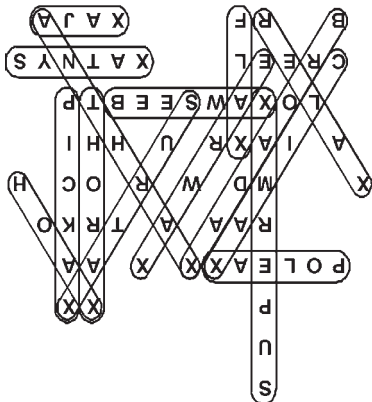

Economic impact study shows livestock auctions are growing in importance for rural vitality

A 2023 economic impact study, which updated a study from 2017, found that livestock auction markets continue to be important for the growth and vitality of rural communities. The study of an average, fixed-facility livestock auction market

revealed that the market provides approximately \$2 million in total value-added dollars to its local community.

This result is up from \$1 million identified in the 2017 Livestock Marketing Association (LMA) Economic Impact Report.

The case livestock auction market, located in a rural Missouri town with a population of less than 5,000, sells all classes of cattle in a weekly sale. The auction market was selected as a representative example of LMA member-livestock

auctions based on type of operation, gross sales of livestock, rural location of market and population of city. LMA represents 85% of the livestock auction markets in the U.S., with cattle being the largest per-head species sold through livestock auction markets annually (32 million head, per 2020 USDA P&S Annual Report data).

Key findings also revealed that the market studied provides 17 jobs,

generating \$888,000 in labor income to the community's economy. Additionally, the market contributes \$447,000 in local taxes and \$108,000 in federal taxes.

Of the total value-added number, contributions were also made by the on-site café, which further provides labor income, state, local and federal taxes.

"Livestock auction markets today remain crit-

ical to helping our rural communities continue to thrive," said Kristen Parman, LMA vice president of membership services. "They generate a competitive sale environment which results in cash for local livestock producers. That cash equals dollars spent in town and investments back into their businesses and operations."

In collaboration with LMA, the study was completed by Decision Innovation Solutions in Urbandale, Iowa.

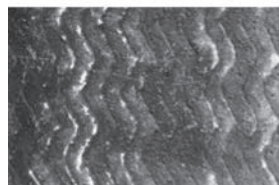
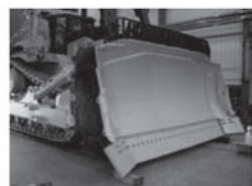

USDA asks Americans to protect plants by looking for invasive pests in April

The USDA is declaring April 2023 Invasive Plant Pest and Disease Awareness Month (IPPDAM). This national outreach month is dedicated to highlighting the impact of invasive plant pests and diseases on plants nationwide and informing Americans how they can help reduce their spread. IPPDAM aims to raise public awareness about the threat and how U.S. residents can help protect U.S. resources from hungry pests.

"Each year, invasive insects and plant diseases cause an estimated \$40 billion in damages to plants that sustain us," said Ag Secretary Tom Vilsack. "Invasive species threaten our food security, agricultural livelihoods and way of life. Luckily, there's a lot we can do to protect our resources. This spring, familiarize yourself with the invasive pest quarantines in your area and do your part to avoid inadvertently moving invasive insects and plant diseases to new areas."

"Many invasive plant pests and diseases are natural hitchhikers and can be hard to see. It's all too easy to unintentionally move them to new areas," said Under Secretary for Marketing and Regulatory Programs Jenny Moffitt. "Invasive Plant Pest and Disease Awareness Month is a reminder to all of us to limit the spread of plant pests and diseases."

Nonnative plant pests can hitchhike in untreated firewood, attach themselves to cars, boats and other outdoor surfaces – or take a ride in the mail. They can travel to new areas on ag material such as soil, seeds, homegrown produce and plants.

Invasive pests have few or no natural predators in their new environments, so their populations quickly outpace native species and spread. These nonnative plant pests and diseases disrupt our ecosystems and reduce biological diversity. Climate change can magnify the impact of invasive species by increasing the level of plant pest infestations and disease infection, allowing pests to produce more generations each year and increasing their suitable habitat. We need the public's help to protect our ecosystems, food supply, livelihoods and way of life from the devastating impact invasive pests have on domestic plant health each year. Together we can make a difference.

To protect domestic plant health:

- Learn about possible quarantines in your area as well as the signs of invasive pest infestation on wild plants and agriculture.

- Invasive plant pest egg masses on outdoor surfaces are easily mistaken for a smear of mud, so it's important to clean your car and outdoor gear before traveling with them to new places.

- If you find signs of new invasive plant pests and diseases in your area, report them to your local Extension office, state Department of Agriculture or your USDA State Plant Health Director's office.

- Don't move untreated firewood, even if it looks pest-free on the outside. To avoid unintentionally spreading tree-killing beetles that hide in firewood, buy or source wood locally or use certified, heat-treated firewood.

- Source your plants and seeds responsibly. When ordering online, ensure the plant is coming from a domestic source or follow import regulations. If you don't know where an ag product is coming from, don't buy it online. U.S. regulations apply to the importer of record – meaning the person purchasing and importing the product from overseas, not the online

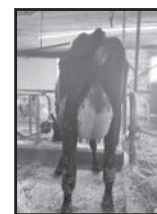

Throughout his life, Kubecka remained active and engaged in the advocacy process for sorghum and U.S. sorghum producers.

cludes an award of \$1,500 to be applied to one semester of tuition expenses and the Kubecka Memorial Scholarship includes an all-expense paid trip to Washington, D.C., with the National Sorghum Producers.
